The community located 20 miles west of Chicago earned the nickname the "Lilac Village" when a local resident bequeathed his estate to the Village, including a garden with over 200 varieties of lilac bushes.

Lombard has many attractions that celebrate its rich and diverse history.


The home of the late Colonel William Plum became the Helen M. Plum Memorial Library; and the lilac garden became a public park, Lilacia Park. Since 1930, the Village has hosted an annual Lilac festival and parade, as well as other lilac-themed celebrations.

The Peck House, which served as the area's first school, was restored and inducted into the National Park Service's Network of Freedom as a verified Underground Railroad location.

Harold Gray, the creator of the Little Orphan Annie cartoon, worked on the cartoons in his Lombard home studio. The cartoons feature some of the Italianate-style home's features including a grand staircase and deck.

In addition to its historic attractions, the Village has a variety of shopping, dining and entertainment venues. Lombard students are served by two elementary and middle school districts; high school students attend "Glenbard" schools, named for the district shared with the Village of Glen Ellyn.

The Metra Union Pacific/West Line railway stops in Lombard, providing commuter transportation to downtown Chicago.
